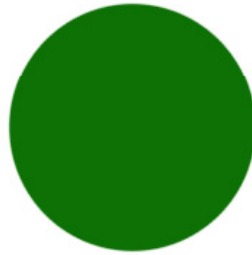

Background, status, use and experience

Scope and Purpose:

The HPH Activity Database section at www.healthpromotinghospitals.org contains information about HP Activities within the HPH Network.

It can function as:

- a way to document HP activities.
- a place to find information about different health promotion activities that has taken and is taking place within the HPH member hospitals and health services.
- a way to identify possible partners for collaboration and the exchange of experience and knowledge.



How does it work?

- Only H/HS Coordinators and N/R Coordinators can enter activities from their own H/HS (or those within the N/R Network)
- Entries can be made either public or private
- All Users and Visitors of www.healthpromotinghospitals.org can view public entries

Entries are made by:

- 1) Logging in
- 2) Going to Activity Database
- 3) Choosing “add item” and “project” in the green bar
- 4) Enter activity information
- 5) Press save

What information can I find?
For each health promotion activity, the database includes information on Title, Contact Person, Abstract, Language of communication and HPH Standard relation.

How do I perform a search?
Search via hospital or network, keywords or related HPH Standard and find ongoing health promotion activities within your area of interest.

Who can register health promotion activities in the database?
The hospital and network coordinators register the activities taking place within their



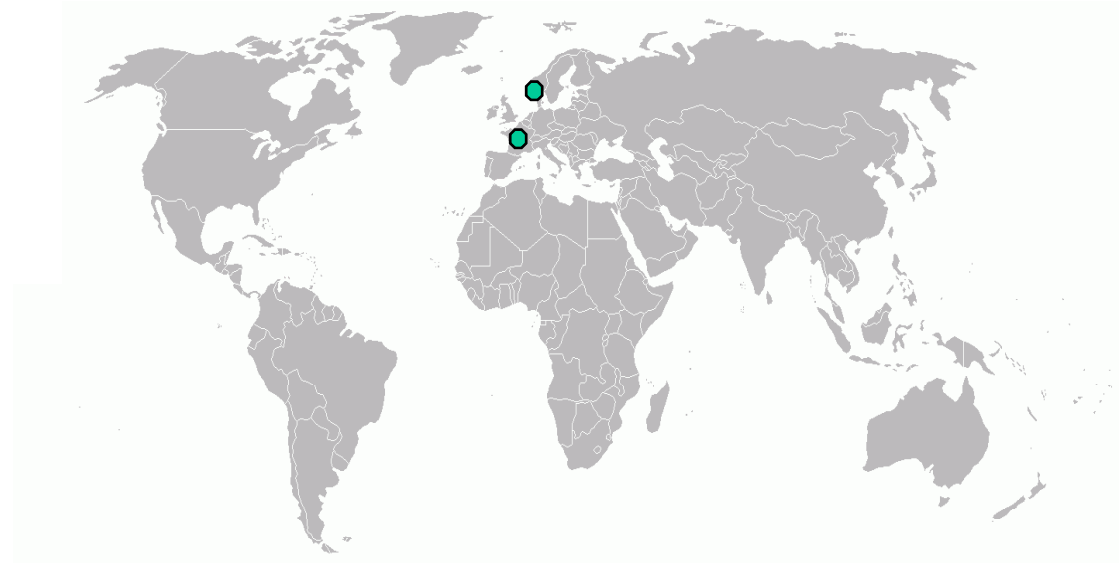

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An example from France...

Title:	Healthy Hospital Nutrition
Hospital:	Centre Hospitalier de Martigues
Network:	French Network of HPH
Background:	In France, the National Nutrition Health Program and the National Health Authorities highlights the importance of nutrition and the development of hospital nutrition policy
Purpose:	Develop a nutrition policy in the hospital and help tagret groups to learn to eat better through health education and health promotion
Methods/actions:	Training and information to patients and population (workshops etc.) Training and information to nurses (and others health professionals)
Target groups:	Children and adolescents / elderly / patients social networks / lower social classes
Results:	At the hospital a Nutrition Committee is created, Screening and management of malnutrition is done for each new patient, An annual symposium is organized on the theme of nutrition, funding was continued.



An example from Norway...

- Title:** A lighter life
- Hospital:** Sørlandet Sykehus HF
- Network:** Norwegian Network of HPH
- Background:** Diabetes type 2 (DM2) is increasing in Norway. It is important to change the lifestyle of people who have increased risk of developing DM2
- Purpose:** Reduce weight and improve fitness in people with elements of metabolic syndrome
- Methods/actions:** Group based intervention by multiple health professionals. Evaluation through randomised controlled trial. Questionnaire. SF36, Smart Diet, Physical activity last 7 days. Observations Bruce treadmill test
- Target groups:** Patients in risk of developing DM2. We use a simple "Diabetes riskscore" developed from the Finish Diabetes Prevention Study by Tuomilehto
- Results:** The project is still running



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HPH Standard Reporting Online

Background, status, use and experience

Scope and Purpose:

The standard report section at www.healthpromotinghospitals.org contains information about standard fulfilment.

It can function as:

- a self-assessment tool for hospitals and networks, which allows monitoring of progress regarding implementation.
- a database of standard reports, which all HPH members can use to maintain an overview of how standards are being fulfilled in an international perspective.
- a way to identify possible partners for collaboration and the exchange of experience and knowledge.



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How does it work?

- Only H/HS Coordinators and N/R Coordinators can enter standard reports for their own H/HS (or those within the N/R Network)
- Entries can be made either public or private (in the future)
- All Users and Visitors of www.healthpromotinghospitals.org can view public entries

Entries are made by:

- 1) Logging in
- 2) Going to Standards section
- 3) Choosing hospital
- 4) Choosing standard(s) to report on
- 5) Filling in the form (s)
- 6) Submitting result(s)

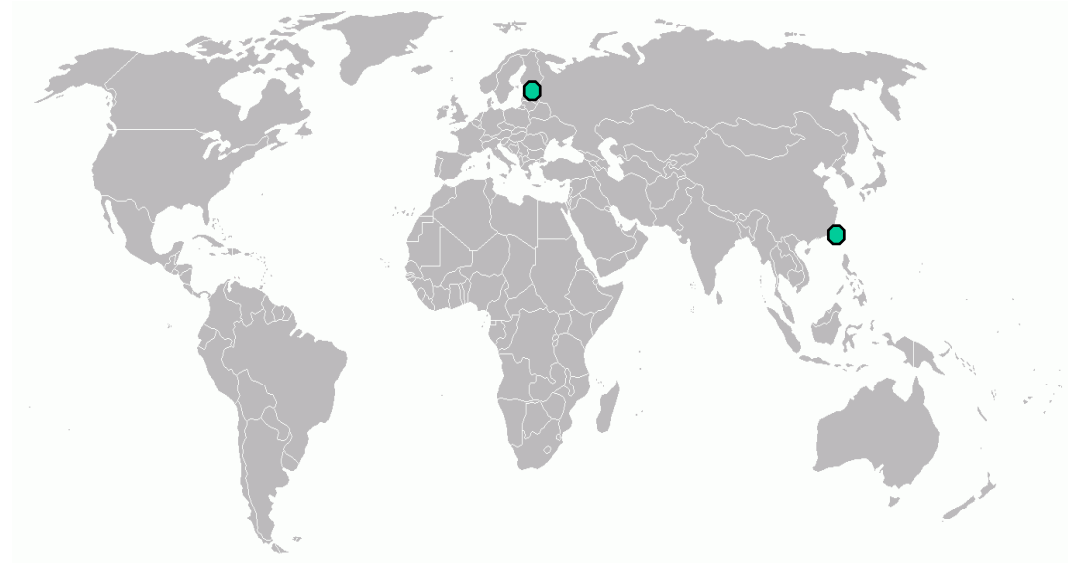

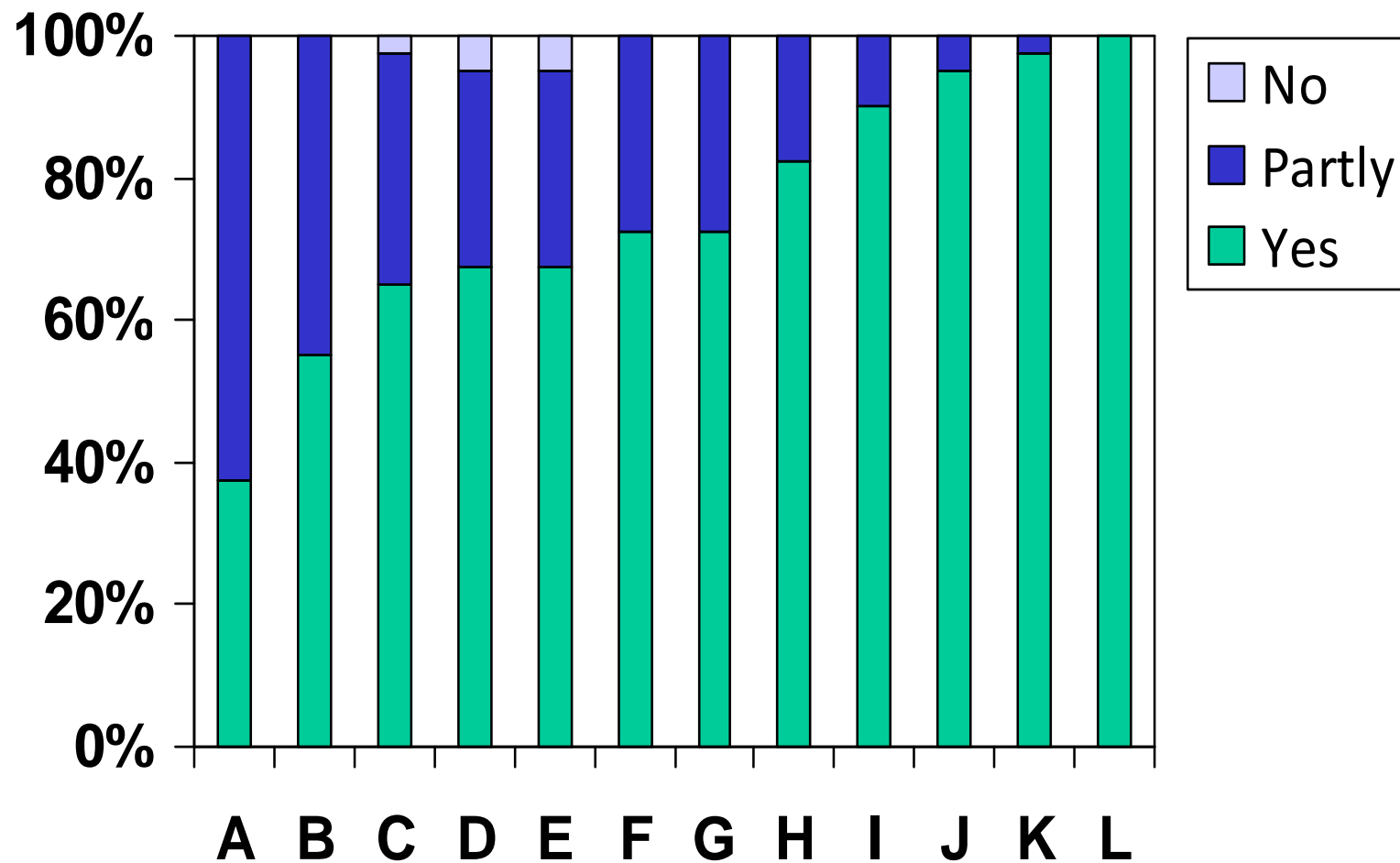


Test H/HS in total: 12
(Apr. 2009)



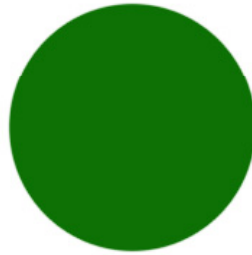
Status – Pilot test findings (12 H/HS)
